Our food distribution ministry, which regularly serves between 250 and 300 families, and has to date provided around 2 million meals, all started with just one phone call. "Would your church want to distribute food from the Atlanta Food Bank?" A couple of meetings later, and we at First Presbyterian Church, were on our way to starting a ministry that has fed thousands of people.

Together we can make a difference.

About 30 years ago a Sunday school class in our church wanted to do something to help "latch-key kids." Since then, generations have grown up through our after-school program, Club 3:30, that now serves 1 in 10 Hickory Hills Elementary School students.

Together our impact resounds.

60 years ago, a group of church members decided we needed a preschool, and now ours is one of the most highly regarded in our community.

This is the power of "we."

When we put our minds and our hearts together things happen.

When God works among us, miracles happen.

For nearly 200 years, God has been at work in our church carrying on the work of those first 12 families. A sanctuary was built by 100 members to seat hundreds. Our legacy of faith dates to the beginning of our town, and now the future is in our hands.

God is still at work among us. Who can say what God will do through us next. However, we must be willing to believe.

That great church leader, John Wesley, encouraged all Methodists, "don't die with money left in your pocket," for what we have been given is what God may use to make this world a better place.

As you read through the following pages, give thanks to God for what He has done and is doing among us, but I also ask you to consider what you might contribute, for together our church will be a place where many lives are changed with faith, hope, and love.

We serve whomever is in need.







In April 2022, we entered into partnership with Sweetwater Mission in Austell. Every Tuesday morning, 12-18 volunteers gather at Sweetwater to help them bag fresh produce and shelf-stable food for us and their other programs. On Tuesday afternoon, Sweetwater delivers pallets of food to our door, where 15-20 volunteers greet families and put the food in cars. Each Tuesday, our volunteers log in a total of about 90 hours.

Since our partnership with Sweetwater began, we have served over 1900 families. Many families visit weekly, others not as often. We serve whomever is in need and do not turn anyone away. We are averaging over 200 households per week. It is the faithful stewardship of every member that allows us to provide diapers and other necessities to our neighbors in need. Together, we supply volunteers and donors, and the church budget provides much of the funding. Preschool students sort our food when needed and Youth, Journey, and Children's Sunday School classes have assembled homeless kits. The congregation provided a pantry-full of food during our 40 for 40 Food Drive and turned out in great numbers at our fundraisers. Lastly, our volunteers talk up our ministry in a very positive way and bring along their friends. We have many dependable volunteers who are not church members, so this is a community outreach in multiple ways.

He was snagged: "hook, line and sinker!" For nearly 25 years, Russell has been a leader in a ministry that, in his words, "blesses me far more than any blessing I may give. It is truly a delight to spread God's word and stories to the young learners. My younger daughter, Margaret (now 31), finally made it to 4th grade where I was waiting to teach her. She has often told me how important the foundation of Biblical understanding she got from Sunday School has been to her knowledge of scripture. If I can keep providing that to our children at FPC Marietta, I will indeed be truly blessed!"
