From Rev. Dr. Paull Sherwood: I wish to lift up the annual Joy Offering for your consideration. Following the devastation of Hurricane Helene, I learned that representatives of our denomination, the PC(USA) reached out immediately to our churches in the impacted areas. They offered grants to those church employees who suffered damage. As of the end of October, they distributed \$400,000 and expect to distribute a total of \$750,000 by the end of the year. I was proud to hear of such speedy assistance to these folks and I am glad to support the Joy Offering.
