Meet Won-Hee An, FPC's Interim Principal Organist

Won-Hee An is a highly demanded educator, pianist, and church musician. She has worked as an orchestral pianist for the Boston Symphony Orchestra alongside notable conductors such as Alan Gilbert and Charles Dutoit. Dr. An has also served as the principal rehearsal pianist for the Boston Symphony Orchestra's Tanglewood Festival Chorus under conductor John Oliver. She has collaborated

with guest conductors and soloists at the BSO, including James Levine, David Robertson, Grant Llewellyn, James Orent, Anne Sophie von Otter, and Albert Dohmen. The repertoire she has played with both BSO and TFC includes Schoenberg's Moses und Aron and Gurrelieder, John Adams' El Niño, Ives' Symphony No. 4, Stravinsky's Petrouchska, Bartok's Bluebeard Castle, and Holiday Pops repertoire.

Dr. An has performed extensively across the United States and Europe at prestigious venues such as Boston Symphony Hall, Museum of Fine Arts, New England Conservatory's Jordan Hall, Boston's Hatch Shell, Faneuil Hall, Weill Hall, Alice Tully Hall, The Juilliard Theater, Miller Theatre at Columbia University, Fenway Center, Vergennes Opera House in Vermont, Gusman Concert Hall in Miami, Temple Emanuel in Newton, International Institute of Music Dozentenkonzert in Bad Faulenbach, Germany, and Konzert Junger Kunstler, Municipal Theater, Kempten, Germany.

Dr. An taught at Northeastern University, focusing on understanding her students' goals and nurturing their love of music. She taught courses on Mozart, four levels of Ear Training, Music Theory for the Music Industry, and Principles of Music Literature. She coached chamber music groups, gave private piano lessons, and oversaw two programs, including "Performance Minor" and "NEC/NU Joint Certificate." Additionally, she has led two faculty-led programs in Austria and South Korea. Dr. An taught the first two "Musicianship Skills" levels at the Hebrew College in Newton, MA, and piano lessons at Walnuthill School of Arts.

After relocating to Atlanta, GA, Dr. An has taught at Kennesaw State University and Gwinnett Technical College.

As a church musician, Dr. An has worked as a music director, organist, and pianist in churches such as Trinity Lutheran Church, First Parish Church, and Grace Korean Presbyterian Church. As a music director, she invites musicians for special occasions, directs the choir, and performs on organ and piano.

Dr. An holds a Doctorate from Boston University, a Graduate Diploma from the New England Conservatory, a master's degree from the Juilliard School, and a Bachelor's degree from the Manhattan School of Music.
